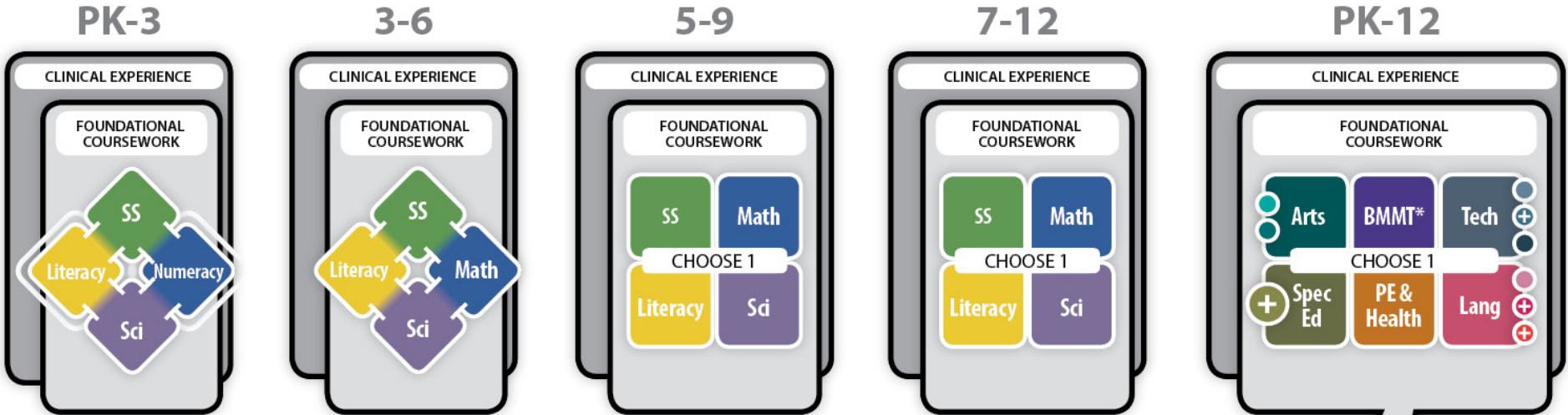

Last Updated 2-5-18

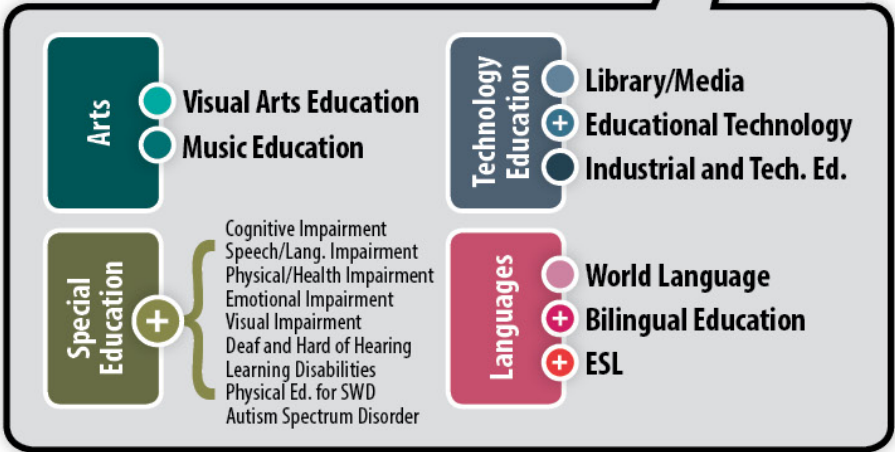

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

- Social-Emotional Competence
- Educational Technology
- Needs of Diverse Learners and Cultural Competence
- Learner-Centered Supports
- Early and Ongoing Clinical Experiences
- Interaction with Special Populations of Students
- Emphasis on Content-Specific Pedagogy
- Assessment Literacy

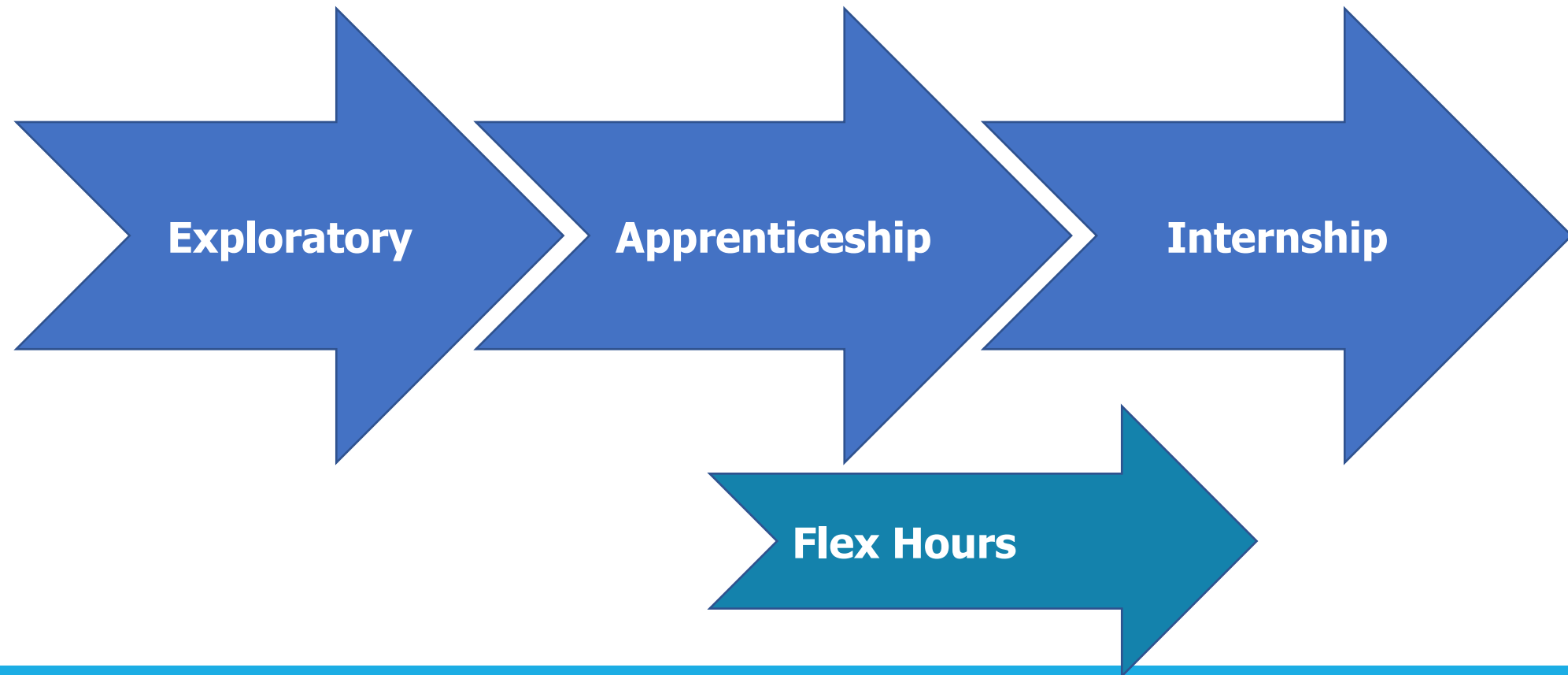
Core Practices

- 19 High-Leverage Practices (HLPs)
- Used constantly & basic for advancing skill in teaching
- Central to supporting students' social-emotional needs
- Consistent across content areas & grade ranges

Initial Preparation: Three Major Phases, 600 Minimum Hours



Exploratory

- A **maximum** of 30 exploratory hours can be counted toward the 600
- Can be in any grade level or subject area

Apprenticeship

- A **minimum** of 70 Student Contact Hours required
- Experiences are co-constructed with PK-12 partners
- Mentors demonstrate exemplary teaching



Internship

- A **minimum** of 300 Student Contact Hours within 12 full time weeks
- Mentors must be credentialed in the area of candidate certification
- Must include opportunities for solo or co-teaching



Flex Hours

- A **minimum** of 200 hours can be counted as Flex Hours during the Apprenticeship or the Internship
- Can be used for additional content or grade band requirements

Adding Endorsements

- Additional Student Contact Hours in the grade band or content area with a focus on pedagogical practice
- Experienced teachers
 - Additional Student Contact Hours
 - Permit process to teach in content or grade band
 - Competency evaluation by district or program
- Special Education requirements remain the same

Clinical and Core Rollout

New Clinical Experience Requirements and Core Practices are expected to be included in new program submissions for PK-3 and 3-6 programs and as new standards are implemented.

Exception

Endorsement programs must have significant clinical experiences focused on pedagogy by Fall 2019.

- Use new requirements guidelines (30 Student Contact Hours)

CAEP Updates

OCTOBER 2018

CAEP Sub-standard 3.2

Michigan – No Basic Skills Examination requirement

CAEP – No AFIs or Stipulations for 3.2 out of 49 SV

No change to 3.2 in agreement

MDE policy: No candidate should be denied program entry or student teaching **solely** because of the “50th percentile on a nationally normed assessment” criteria

CAEP Component 3.2

Options

1. Programs maintain 3.0 GPA requirement
2. Candidates with scores – demonstrate a cohort average in 50th percentile
3. Candidates without scores – achieve a pre-determined grade on general education courses (Math, Writing, Literature) – provide documented support
4. Maintain two cohorts, compare over time

CAEP Program Review

Completed prior to Self-Study Report (SSR)

SPA reports completed within three years of visit

Michigan will use state review or SPA only

State review of programs one year prior to site visit

No CAEP Program Review with Feedback (not an option for Michigan)
