

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE: DID NOT PASS

- Garcia package
- Reading diagnostics elimination
- Freezing student growth percentage for evaluations – will increase to 40%
- Student teaching background check
- Expand GSRP to 3 year olds

PASSED LEGISLATION: HB 4421

- Substitute teachers
 - Allows for either:
 - 60 credits
 - In an industrial tech or CTE program, a HS diploma with a professional license
 - Removed the age restriction for subbing

PASSED LEGISLATION: HB 5526

- Establishes A-F grading system for public schools
 - Proficiency in mathematics and English language arts
 - Student growth in mathematics and English language arts
 - English Learners' growth toward proficiency in English
 - Academic performance compared to similar schools
 - Graduation rate



PASSED LEGISLATION: SCHOOL SAFETY PACKAGE

- HB 5828: School safety commission
- HB 5829: Local school board liaison to commission
- HB 5850: OK2Say permanent
- HB 5851: Schools submit annual reports
- HB 5852: Law enforcement active shooter training

2019 LEGISLATION: HB 4054 – SCHOOL COUNSELORS

- Require districts to employ 1 counselor for every 450 students.





Last Updated 2-5-18








TEACHER LOCATION REPORT



CAEP ANNUAL REPORT

WHAT TO KEEP IN MIND

CAEP ANNUAL REPORT

- System opens in January
- Open for 90 days
- Last year's reviews completed by volunteers
- Two reviewers for each Annual Report

CAEP ANNUAL REPORT

- Reviewers flag any information inconsistent between years (looking at current and previous reports)
- Reviewers also verify information if possible by clicking links and checking with accreditors
- Numbers should come from Title II reports
- Only major changes should be reported in Substantive Changes
- Address ALL prompts in narratives.

CAEP ANNUAL REPORT

- Display of Annual Reporting Measures
 - Public display of measures
 - One click access
 - Reports that must be downloaded and then read to see information not idea
 - Expectation all 8 measures are displayed

CAEP ANNUAL REPORTING MEASURES

- Impact Measures (CAEP Standard 4)
 1. Impact on P-12 learning and development
 2. Indicators of teaching effectiveness
 3. Satisfaction of employers and employment milestones
 4. Satisfaction of completers

CAEP ANNUAL REPORTING MEASURES

- Outcome Measures
 5. Graduation rates
 6. Ability of completers to meet certification requirements (Title II)
 7. Ability of completers to be hired in ed positions for which they have been prepared
 8. Student loan default rates

CAEP ANNUAL REPORT

- Section 4 (Reporting Measures)
 - 4.2 requires a summary and analysis of the data included for the 8 measures
 - Reviewers are asked to flag if all of the prompts provided are not addressed

CAEP ANNUAL REPORT

- Section 5 AFIs, Stipulations, Weaknesses
 - Attend to the AFIs/Stipulation/Weaknesses in last Accreditation visit
 - Provide data on how you are addressing
- Section 6 Continuous Improvement
 - Address all prompts provided
 - Clear information linked to data
