

# Office of Educator Excellence DARTEP Update October 6, 2023

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### SECTION I: Legislative Updates

Below is a selection of bills currently before the Michigan Senate and House of Representatives. This selection is limited to *educator workforce related bills with activity* since the <u>April 14, 2023 DARTEP update</u>.

### **Newly Introduced Bills**

- SB 354 National teacher licensing exam requirements. *Referred to Education Committee 5/24/2023.*
- SB 395 & 396 Performance evaluation systems for teachers and administrators. Referred to Education Committee 6/15/2023.
- SB 512 Modify school aid penalties for noncompliance with employing certified educators. *Referred to Appropriations Committee 9/19/2023.*
- HB 5010 & 5011 Require classroom management course for teachers and training for substitute teachers. *Referred to Education Committee 9/14/2023.*

### **Active Bills (Moving)**

- SB 518 Extend the sunset on alternative route programs for special education. Discussed at Education Committee Hearing in September 2023.
- HB 4081 Establish a minimum number of school counselors to be employed by a district. *Introduced 2/15/2023. Discussed at Health Policy Committee Hearing in September 2023. Not yet voted out of Committee.*

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- HB 4549 Substitute teacher requirements. Reported out of committee with substitute bill 5/23/23. No vote by House yet.
- HB 4752 Retiree employment. *Passed by the House. Reported out of the Senate Committee with a substitute bill. No vote in Senate yet.*
- HB 5021 Teacher pensions. Discussed at Education Committee Hearing in September 2023. Not yet voted out of committee.

### • Certificate Progression and Reciprocity Changes (Public Acts 110 & 111)

Legislation PA 110 and 111 of 2023, signed by Governor Whitmer on July 26, 2023, contain several provisions to support the recruitment and retention of educators. and build on the governor's work to attract more talent to Michigan. MDE supported these bills in alignment with strategic goals to increase the quantity, quality, and diversity of educators for Michigan's students. PA 110 and 111 contribute to this in doing the following:

- Remove out-of-state 18 credit hours or a master's degree requirement.
- Explicitly expand authority for reciprocity for teaching certificates to Tribes and other countries.
- Allow for three years of teaching or school counselor experience for out-of-state applicants in lieu of the MTTC.
- Expand the experience types permitted for progression to more advanced teacher certification.
- Eliminate first aid/CPR requirement as a condition for initial certification.
   Provide for requirement of first aid/CPR as part of professional learning for newly employed teachers.

MOECS has been updated to accommodate the elimination of <a href="the-First Aid/CPR">the First Aid/CPR</a> requirement for initial teacher certification. Please continue to advise candidates applying for certification of this change.

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### CPAST

Over the last year, OEE has been working with EPPs who volunteered to pilot the CPAST observation tool. Two EPPs, Central Michigan University and the University of Michigan-Dearborn, will use the tool for their candidates in fall 2023. Siena Heights University will trial the tool this fall with a small number of candidate volunteers. Other providers may trial the tool for at least some of their candidates in spring 2024.

As a reminder, providers raised the need for a common observation tool during the performance score redesign. MDE focused on the CPAST given that it is specifically designed for candidates and uses consensus scoring (i.e., the candidate, supervisor, and cooperating teacher meet to discuss the candidate's performance). The intent of the pilot is to better understand the benefits of the tool and the burdens for providers to transition to the tool.

### • Data Reporting: Tribal Affiliation

Public Act 103 of 2023 updated data collection requirements within <u>MCL 388.1619</u>. Subsection 7 now requires districts to collect and submit tribal affiliation data for all students and staff within state student (MSDS) and staffing (REP) data systems.

These data systems are housed by the Center for Educational Performance Information (CEPI). CEPI is working in consultation with representatives at the Confederation of Michigan Tribal Education Departments (CMTED) and MDE's Indigenous Education Initiative (MDE-IEI). At present, this does not directly impact reporting for post-secondary education but is worth monitoring.

### • EPI Performance Management System

OEE is in the process of analyzing data for the 2024 EPI Performance Score. In the fall, the focus is on calculating the diversity of candidate placements. As a reminder, diversity information is available only for candidates who had a placement in a Michigan public school. Candidates placed outside of Michigan or at a non-public school cannot be included in the analysis unless supplemental data is provided by the EPPs.

A template was distributed in mid-September so that EPPs could add placement data for any placement data not captured by the Candidate Suite Surveys. This template can be used to provide placement information for candidates who either (1) were not included in the survey data MDE returned to the EPPs in summer 2023 due to non-responses by the candidate, supervisor, AND cooperating teacher, and (2) candidates who took the survey but were placed at a non-public school or a school outside of Michigan. For the latter group, EPPs will need to provide the diversity information for the school in order for the candidate to be included in the calculation.

Please return the template by the end of December if you wish to have the additional data included in MDE's calculations.

### • Guidelines and Resources Appendix to the ESL (NS) Endorsement Standards

The appendix to the NS Endorsement's 2018 preparation standards will be released later this month. It includes implementation recommendations and assessment resources contributed by P-20 practitioners and faculty who collaborated remotely over several sessions. ### Grow Your Own (GYO) Staff Grants

An 11-member committee completed their scoring and consensus meetings on Friday, September 29, 2023, for the second round of the 27b GYO School Staff Grants. Between July 12 and September 6, 2023, second-round applications for the \$91.9 million of federal funds left over from the first round of grants announced in May 2023 were gathered from Michigan LEAs, ISDs, and PSAs. All LEAs, ISDs, and PSAs were invited to apply for the second round of funding, regardless of past application status.

Following a campaign that included the July 25 informational webinar, social media posts, website communications, updated FAQs, and special "Office Hours" to field questions from interested LEAs, ISDs, and PSAs, a total of 104 applications were submitted by the 9/6/23 deadline. Over the remaining weeks of September, each of three teams were assigned a portion of the applications and their accompanying EPP partnership agreements to be scored against an updated scoring rubric, with dedicated virtual meeting times set aside for team scoring reviews and consensus discussions facilitated by MDE staff.

Currently, the score report and the table of EPP partnership agreements are under review by the internal MDE team, who anticipate a mid-November grant award announcement date. More information will be made available over the coming weeks on the MDE's GYO School Staff Grants website.



#### MI Stipend Program Process Requirements:

MI Fellowship Program Process Requirements:

- The institution must certify a payment record for each student to receive a payment from Treasury.
- Students may be certified by their institution as "No" for not meeting program requirements. Students may be certified by their institution as "No" for one semester and paid in another semester. This will create duplicate counts for categories processed by semester and may be great than or equal to the Total Eligible Student count,
- MDE reported 2,033 student teachers to Treasury for 2022-23.
- NOTE: 2023-24 Fall application opened May 1, 2023: 1,553 received;
- \* The total applications received reflects both eligible and ineligible students
- \*\*Students identified as eligible include counts of students who passed the initial eligibility screening from the application and students who have not yet been confirmed meeting the program requirements during the institution's certification.

### • MTTC: Health (MI043 MA) & Phys. Ed. (MI044 MB) Tests Closed September 30, 2023

As a reminder, the <u>Health (MI043)</u> and <u>Phys. Ed. (MI044)</u> MTTC tests are no longer available to candidates as of September 30, 2023. Candidates seeking the MA or MB endorsements must have tested by September 30. The Health and Physical Education subtests (MI112 & MI113) for the MC endorsement cannot be used to fulfill the MA or MB testing requirements.

### • MTTC: Equity and Access Committee (formerly Bias Review Committee)

The MTTC Bias Review Committee has a new name: MTTC Equity and Access Committee. This change was made on the advisement of the Technical Advisory Committee and reflects the goal of the committee's work as more than reviewing test items for biased language.

### MTTC: Higher Education Faculty Needed for Reviews

MTTC content depends on input from early career teachers, experienced teachers who have supervised student teachers, and higher education faculty who prepare teacher candidates. Committee members are eligible to receive SCECH credits, a stipend from MDE, and substitute reimbursement (paid to the district), as well as travel accommodations for in-person meetings.

### • MTTC: Higher Education Faculty Practice Test Access

Higher education faculty who serve on MTTC Content Advisory Committees (e.g., Middle Grades ELA test objective review, Lower Elementary (PK-3) Literacy item review, Early Childhood General and Special Ed (B-K) standard setting) will receive access to a full-length practice test. Practice tests will be distributed retroactively to higher education faculty who have served or will serve on Content Advisory Committees for the following fields:

- Cognitive Impairment (MI115)

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Due to the nature of the test development schedule, practice tests will be available to higher education faculty on or near the date they are available to candidates (when registration opens, usually 1-2 months before a test becomes operational).

Evaluation Systems will prioritize distributing practice tests to higher education faculty who have previously served on Lower Elementary (PK-3) and Upper Elementary (3-6) Content Advisory Committees. Early Childhood General and Special Education (B-K) will follow, with other retroactive fields after that. Moving forward, newly developed practice tests will be provided upon publication.
