2. A vote to approve an application will be held at the DARTEP meeting following the submission of the application. A majority of regular members present at the meeting is required for approval.
3. Associate members are non-voting members.





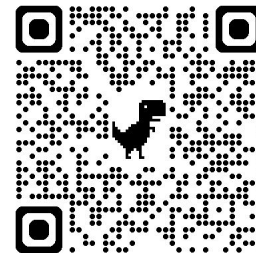

The educator preparation providers (EPPs) which have been approved to offer teacher preparation in Michigan are key partners in the recruitment, education, certification, and retention of the effective educators who work throughout the state. Individuals at the EPPs fill a variety of roles and responsibilities, which are configured differently at the specific EPPs. - SB 354: Licensing examination, passed by the Senate with a substitute bill (12/04/2024).
- HB 5649: Computer science elective, reported out of the Senate Education Committee (10/24/2024).
- SB 995: Student teaching stipend for early childhood, reported out of the Education Committee (10/24/2024).

- SB 567 & 568: Dyslexia training for pre-service and in-service teachers. Now Public Act 146 & 147.

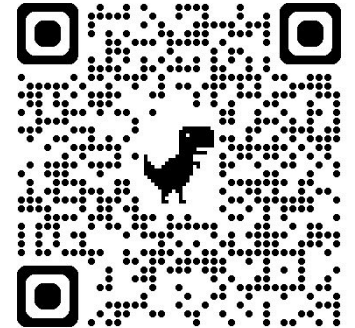

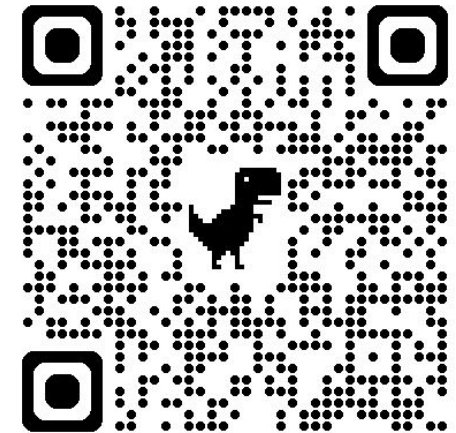

PK-12 Professional Knowledge and Skills

- Reminder: PK-12 (K-12) completers will need a PKS test for certification as of January 1, 2026
- PK-12 and K-12 candidates choose PKS test (Pk-3, 3-6, 5-9, 7-12)
- Please communicate with individual program leads – **MDE does not do this**
- Music and Visual Arts new standards – to SBE in 2025

MTTC Administrator Tests: Timeline

- MOECS will NOT look for a test score until Fall 2025
- Good faith effort now until Fall 2025
- Not required for administrator certification until Fall 2025

MTTC Administrator Tests: Vouchers

- Vouchers must be used for registration by March 30 but can schedule for a test up to 1 year from registration
- Vouchers were sent to EPPs on July 5, 2024

MTTC Administrator Tests: Benefits

- Candidate benefits:
 - Good faith effort is a lower bar for passing
 - Test for free with a voucher
- EPP benefits:
 - Get early data on candidate performance in ResultsAnalyzer
 - Subarea analysis to identify areas for improvement before transition to panel-recommended cutscore

Accreditation: Advanced Program Systems

Advanced Program Coordination

- Cannot be left to the advanced programs alone
- **MUST** be coordinated by accreditation coordinator
 - Trained individual
 - Mindful of system across programs
 - Cohesive with initial report

Recruitment & Retention

GYO Staff FY23 Grant (27b)



- Final reallocations complete
 - Watch for outreach from districts planning additional cohorts
- Watch for new EPP agreement requests
 - From R3 awardees and districts receiving additional funds via reallocation
- 12/2026 expenditure deadline
 - For district reimbursement from grant
 - Some EPPs are developing billing plans with districts to accommodate deadline

GYO EXPLORE FY25 Grant



- Awards pending for FY25 Section 504 EXPLORE grant
- Same goals as last fiscal year
 - \$10,000 per school for **EXPLORE programs** (teacher experience programs for students in grades 6-12)
 - \$10,000 per graduate of EXPLORE programs who are school staff members for pre-preparation program **tuition support**
- Look for contact from local districts
 - Support for **creating** student programs
 - Course **articulation** for tuition grant
 - **Payment** arrangements

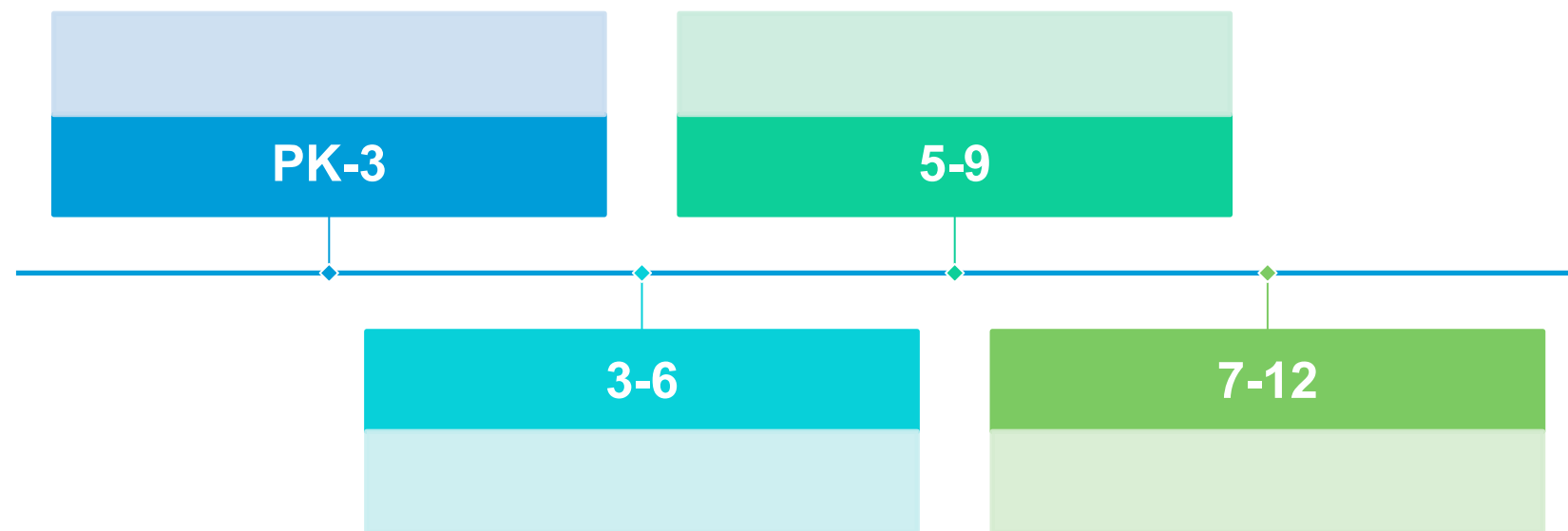
The DLPS Application Timely and Multi- Purposed

Implementation goal:

- An aligned system of teacher preparation in literacy across all endorsement areas, PK-12
- DLPS application process also includes:
 - Guidance for reviewing reading diagnostic coursework and reporting updates
 - Guidance for PA 147 requirements for preparation of candidates in dyslexia.
- Completed application due to MDE June 30, 2025

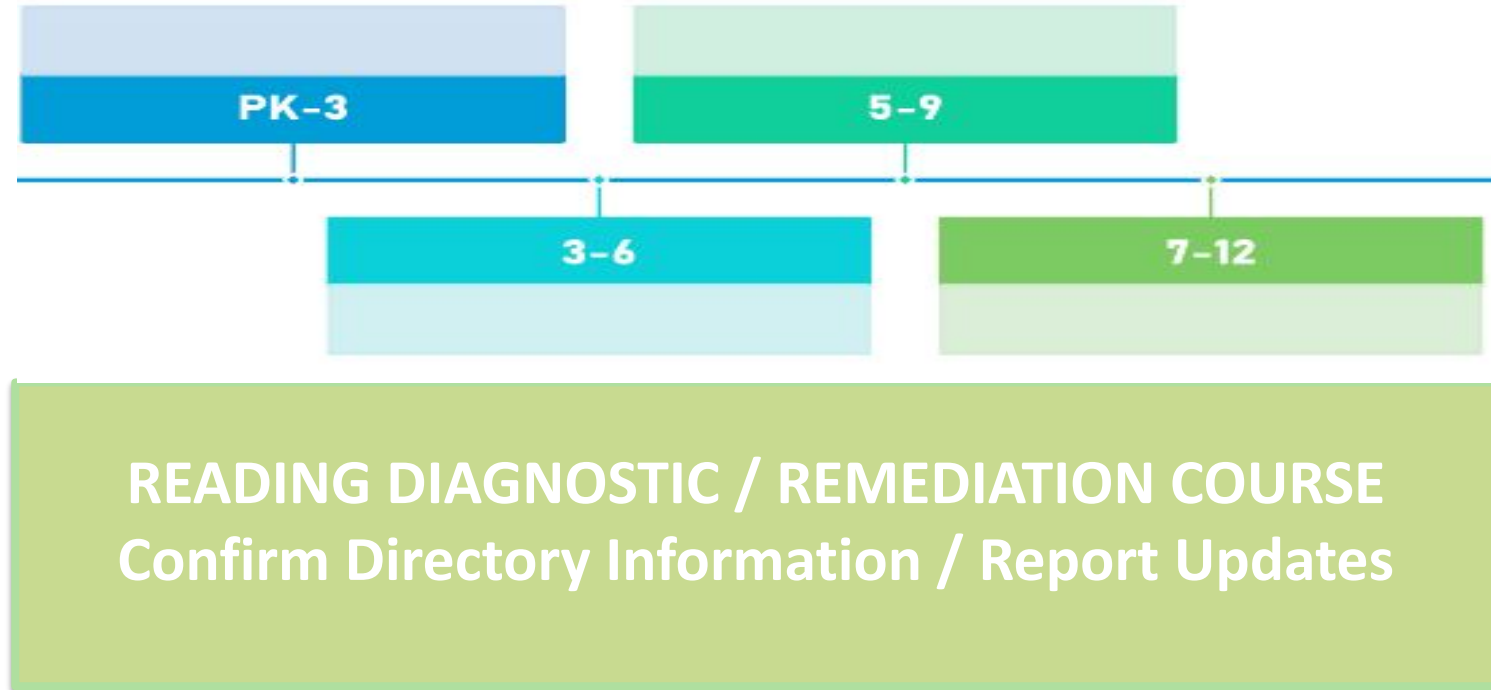

DLPS Application: Part A: 1 - 5



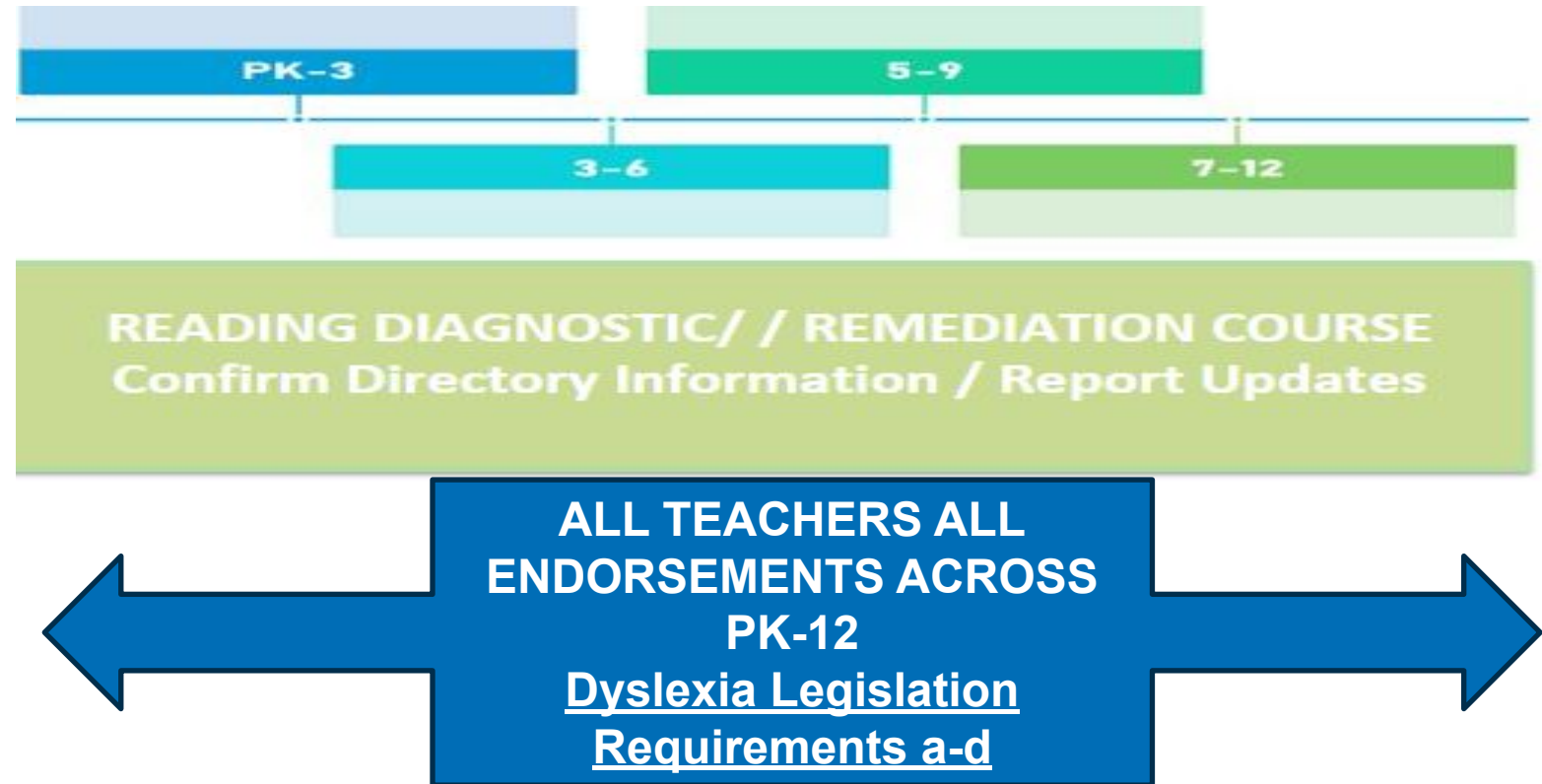

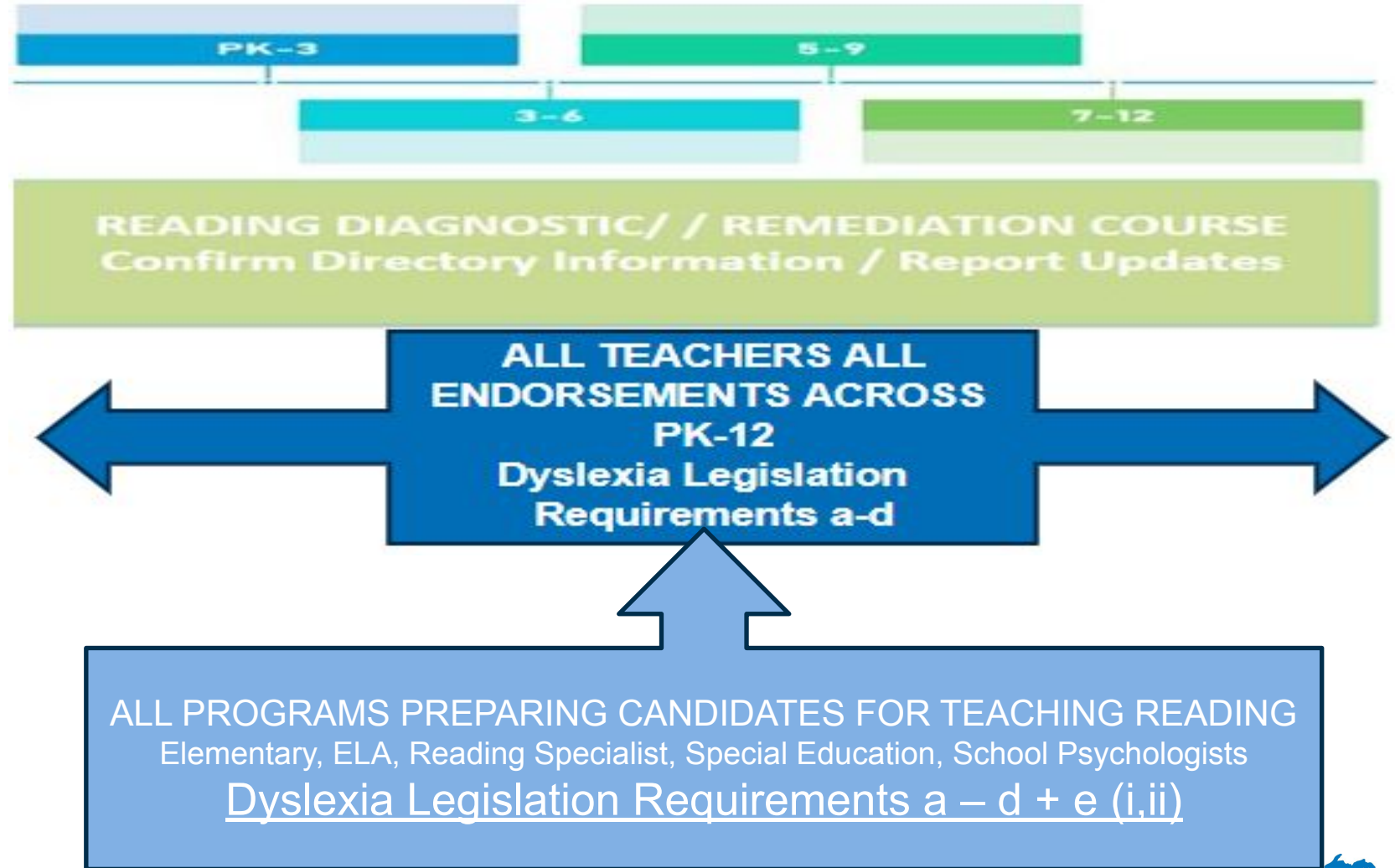

Continuum of Literacy Preparation Timeline

- **December 12, 2024:** Registration opens for series of six DLPS collaborative working sessions Jan-June 2025.
- **June 30, 2025:** DLPS Application Due - Must include responses to *both Part A and Part B*
- **August 30, 2025:** EPPs receive feedback for implementation for DLPS Course of Study fall 2025
- **October 30, 2025:** EPPs receive feedback on dyslexia course of study in alignment to legislation requirements
- **June 30, 2026:** EPPs submit finalized dyslexia course of study with requirements for implementation fall 2026.
- **August 30, 2026:** EPPs receive feedback and determination letter on dyslexia course of study.

Starter Questions

- Should every area (elementary, secondary, P & K-12 program) submit separate application documents during the June 2025 window?
- If New Disciplinary Literacy Standards Course of Study is effective fall 2025, does this mean we cannot recommend students graduating in Dec 2025 on their former plan of study?
- The application references DLPS for ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies. What about World Languages, ESL, Arts, and other PK-12, K-12 endorsements?
- With EPP implementation of Dyslexia preparation beginning fall 2026, how do we address situation of candidates who are more than halfway through their former plan of study?

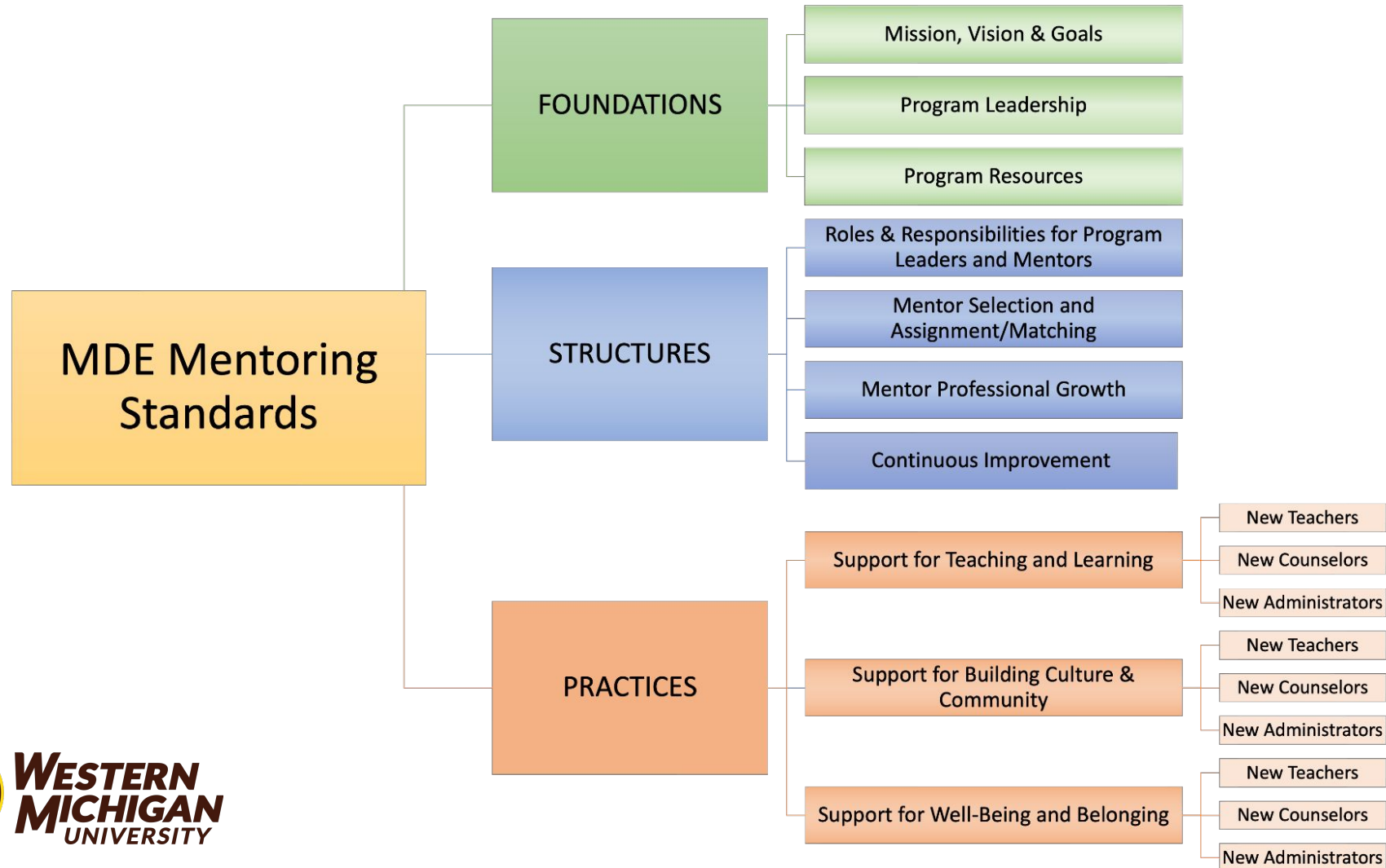
