

Office of Educator Excellence DARTEP Update December 6, 2024

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SECTION I: Legislative Updates

Below is a selection of bills currently (as of November 24, 2024) before the Michigan Senate and the House of Representative. This selection is limited to educator workforce related bills with activity since the October 4, 2024 DARTEP update. 2023-2024 Legislative Session

As this legislative session closes, any bills introduced in 2023-2024 that are not passed will need to be re-introduced in 2025 in order to move forward next year.

Newly Introduced Bills

• HB 6107 - licensing tests for out-of-state candidates - introduced 11/13/2024.

Active Bills (Moving)

- SB 354 Licensing Examination reported out of the Education Committee with a substitute bill (11/07/2024). The bill will now go to the Senate floor for a vote before moving to the House.
- HB 5649 Computer Science elective reported out of the Senate Education Committee (10/24/2024). The bill will now go to the Senate floor for a vote.
- SB 995 Student Teaching Stipend for Early Education reported out of the Education Committee (10/24/2024) and will go to the Senate floor for a vote.

Passed Bills

- SB 567 & 568 Dyslexia training for pre-service and in-service teachers. *Now Public Act 146 & 147*.
- SB 744 Teacher Probationary Period. Now Public Act 134.

SECTION III: Office of Educator Excellence Updates

Dyslexia Summit

The MiMTSS Technical Assistance Center is hosting a free virtual dyslexia summit, January 31, 2025 from 8:30 am to 4 pm. MDE is encouraging PK-12 districts to host a groups of attendees who could watch together and have opportunities to discuss learning. We encourage literacy faculty and teacher candidates to watch together. The summit has a limit of 500 attendees, and all sessions will be recorded and available on demand. Summit attendees will have access to four speakers throughout the day who will share their knowledge and expertise in supporting students with dyslexia within a multitiered system of support. EPI Performance Management System

<u>Candidate Tracking:</u> Thank you to all the EPPs for using the MOECS tracking system to start the rostering process. We continue to meet with DTMB to enhance and streamline the candidate tracking system in MOECS.

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At this point, EPPs are asked to continue using the system by enrolling all remaining candidates in their general education program. This includes candidates scheduled to start their clinical internship in Spring/Summer 2025 as well as all other general education candidates not yet in the system. All general education candidates should be in the system with an updated status by June 30, 2025.

Note: Candidates enrolled in advanced or special programs do not need be enrolled at this time, but we encourage EPPs to include them as they develop procedures for enrolling all candidates, regardless of program, into the system.

OEE is working on an updated guide to reflect upcoming changes to the system based on user feedback as well as expanding the FAQ section to include questions from the EPPs in October.

Webinar Discussion: OEE will host a webinar on January 14 to gather EPP feedback about the system as well as discuss recent changes.

<u>Candidate Placement Diversity:</u> OEE is in the process of calculating candidate placement diversity scores, which can only be done for candidates placed at a public school in the State of Michigan. A communication was distributed on December 2 to MDE's survey contact list, which included a template for providing supplementary information to OEE for candidates placed outside of Michigan and/or at a Michigan non-public school.

MTTC: Expiring Scores for Old Programs & Candidate Outreach

As detailed <u>below</u> in the Reminders section and in the <u>October DARTEP updates</u>, EPPs transitioning between old and new programs should reach out to candidates who completed old program requirements and passed the relevant MTTC(s) but who have not yet applied for Michigan teaching certificates. To avoid having to take new MTTCs, program completers must apply prior to the five-year validity period for the scores expires. They will *not* qualify for the flexibility to utilize old scores detailed in MDE's MTTC <u>Five-Year Validity and Retesting Policy</u> as the new tests supersede the old ones, and a recommendation for certification denotes that a candidate satisfies all standards and program requirements in effect at the time of the endorsement is issued. Please note that program completers whose scores for MI063 who have not yet applied for a Learning Disabilities (SM) endorsement are no longer able to use those old scores as MI063 was replaced by MI114 in December 2019 and all test scores on MI063 are now considered expired. MDE strongly advises EPPs to reach out to program completers who have not applied for certification in phase-out programs and encourage them to apply to avoid having to take the new test. Next on the horizon are Cognitive Impairment (SA) and

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Emotional Impairment (SE), as passing scores on MI056 and MI059 (respectively) will no longer be useable for endorsement as of July 2026.

MTTC: New Tests - Administrator (ES & CO Endorsements)

Test update for the current Elementary & Secondary School Administrator (ES) and Central Office Administrator (CO) endorsements:

- MOECS will not look for a passing MTTC score ("met minimum requirements" during the good faith effort period) until Fall 2025 at the earliest.
- o The good faith effort period will continue until Fall 2025.
- MDE provided test vouchers to EPPs with the goal of covering test fees for the first cohort (email Bridgett with questions).
- Passing criteria will be phased in, progressing to panel-recommended cut scores in Fall 2025 (as per usual MDE policy).
- Candidates expecting to apply for ES or CO in Fall 2025 or later should at a minimum:
 - Register for their test before March 30, 2025 (voucher expiration date)
 - Test before Fall 2025 (when panel-recommended cut scores will be required for test passage)

MTTC: New Tests - Science (7-12)

MDE is proud to launch Science (7-12). Key dates to know:

- o December 3, 2024: Registration opens
- January 28-29, 2025: Standard Setting Conference, faculty are strongly encouraged to apply
- o February 17, 2025: First appointments available
- March 2025: First scores reported

As a reminder, a Professional Knowledge and Skills test is required for grade-banded endorsements, including 7-12 fields.

MTTC: Test Preparation

MDE recommends the following MTTC test preparation resources:

- <u>Study Materials</u> describes how to identify and use study materials that have been designed for MTTC test-takers
- Webinar a <u>recorded webinar</u> on the MTTC program, how to identify and use study materials, and how to interpret your score report. <u>Annotated slides</u> used in the webinar are also available to peruse at your own pace.

Please note that **MDE exclusively recommends** materials that have been *designed for* our teacher candidates, understanding that supplemental materials (e.g., course notes or readings, K-16 student texts or artifacts) are also valuable aids in preparing for an exam.

MDE does not recommend "MTTC prep" materials that are marketed to candidates, such as Learning Liaisons, Passage Preparation, Mometrix, 240 Tutoring, Study.com, or similar. These materials tend to be poorly aligned to MTTC test objectives and/or

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factually incorrect. These items also tend to be written in a style or to a cognitive level (i.e., DOK) significantly less than typical MTTC items. For these reasons, candidates who use *marketed to* materials tend to study incorrect material that is not reflective of the style and depth of questions on an actual exam.

Additionally, **MDE does not recommend** flashcards, quizlets, or other materials which claim to be actual test content. Distribution and possession of actual test content is a breach of test security and the terms and conditions required of anyone taking an MTTC test. Penalties for possession of actual test content can include <u>civil or even criminal action</u>.

Reading Instruction Across Content Disciplines Forum

On December 12, EducationWeek will host a free virtual forum on supporting adolescent readers across discipline areas. An agenda and registration link is available here, and registrants will get access to an on-demand recording. This forum is a promising resource for supporting programs with implementation of the 5-9/7-12 Disciplinary Literacy standards as well as for supporting candidates with becoming proficient in them.

Standards Development: Special Education Teacher

OEE and the Office of Special Education (OSE) will present proposed standards for a new Special Education Teacher endorsement to the State Board of Education on January 14, 2025. Public comment on these standards will be available from January 16 – February 27, 2025.

The Michigan Talent Pool is a group of elementary and secondary educators nominated by their supervisors that the Michigan Department of Education draws upon throughout the year when opportunities for engagement and recognition become available.

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We welcome recommendations of outstanding classroom teachers and/or principals who exhibit strong potential for professional leadership, and demonstrate the following:

- Exceptional educational talent as evidenced by effective instructional practices and student learning results in the classroom and school;
- Exemplary educational accomplishments beyond the classroom;
- Contributions to education that are largely unheralded, yet are worthy of the spotlight; and
- An engaging and inspiring presence that motivates and impacts students, colleagues and the community.

Recommendations to the Talent Pool should be submitted by the nominee's supervisor and can be made via the <u>online recommendation form</u>.

The nomination form includes a one-page letter of recommendation explaining how the nominee meets the above criteria. Please note that these recommendations are confidential and should not be discussed with the recommended educator or others in your school or community.

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SECTION IV: Office of Educator Excellence Reminders

CPAST

Select EPPs continue to pilot the CPAST observation tool during the 2024-25 academic year. During this time, the group will continue to collect data before MDE makes decisions about whether and how to include the tool in the annual performance score. Survey results of participants using the tool during the 2023-24 academic year were positive, with many acknowledging the value of the tool's use of consensus meetings to provide enhanced feedback to candidates about their performance.

MI Future Educator Fellowship & Future Educator Student Teacher Stipend

The MIStudentAid team at MiLEAP debuted a <u>dashboard</u> to provide public data on the Fellowship and Stipend programs for teacher candidates. Not only does it provide the same benchmarks as previous data slides shared by MiLEAP, but all data are also sortable by House District, Senate District, EPP, and County of Residence, for both the 2023-24 and 2024-25 academic years. MTTC: Expiring Scores for Old Programs & Candidate Outreach

As part of program closure, EPPs should reach out to candidates who completed program requirements and passed the relevant MTTC but have not yet applied for their credential in MOECS.

Old tests for the following content areas were replaced with a new test. The replacement was immediate, and the date of change is noted in the table.

NOTE: Candidates whose scores for MI063 who have not yet applied for their Learning Disabilities endorsement are no longer able to use those old scores as the test has had a significant update in the last 5 years. MDE strongly advises EPPs to reach out to such candidates, encouraging them to apply for their credentials to avoid having to take the new test. EPPs should continue to look for candidates who passed MI056 and MI059, as these scores will no longer be usable as of July 2026.

The following content areas have experienced/are experiencing an overlap with old endorsements phasing out while new endorsements phase in. The content, old test (and end date), new test(s) (and start dates) and new endorsement(s) are shown.

As described in MDE's MTTC Five-Year Validity and Retesting Policy, candidates whose scores are more than five years old for any of the above tests will need to retest (see scenario 2 in the policy) because a significant change has occurred with their content area exam. To minimize the number of candidates who need to retest with the new exam, EPPs should identify candidates who completed program requirements and passed the old MTTC within the last 5 years and strongly encourage them to apply for their endorsement in MOECS. Candidates who try to apply with scores older than 5 years for these fields will not be allowed to use expired scores toward their endorsement.

*ZS, ZG, BA, BX, and EX (x2) are included in the table as a reminder that these programs are currently phasing out and exams will end soon. Because the associated tests have not *yet* ended, candidates for these fields do not *yet* face the same urgency as others noted in this section; however, these programs are typically larger for many EPPs. As such, EPPs should begin outreach to candidates who have not yet applied for their endorsement to avoid a significant spike in outreach later. EPPs should also consider processes and timelines to communicate with candidates in sunsetting other secondary programs (Integrated Science and Social Studies).

MTTC: Higher Education Representatives Needed for Reviews

MTTC content depends on input from early career teachers, experienced teachers who have supervised student teachers, and higher education representatives who prepare teacher candidates.

All committee members are eligible to receive:

- SCECHs (8 SCECHs per planned day of work)
- Paid stipend (\$75 for up to 1 full day of planned work, \$150 for meetings planned to exceed 1 full day of work)
- o Substitute reimbursement, paid directly to a school/district
- Higher education representatives will receive a voucher code for a practice test (see next item!)

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MTTC: Higher Education Representatives Receive Practice Test Access

As an additional incentive to volunteer, higher education representatives who serve on MTTC committees will receive access to a full-length practice test of their choice. Following the committee meeting, Pearson will distribute a voucher code to higher education representatives. Higher education representatives will receive a voucher code **every time** they serve. The voucher code can be used to purchase a full-length practice test for any area, and codes can be given to others.

Due to the nature of the test development schedule, the practice test for a given field is available when registration for the field opens, usually 1-2 months before the first available test appointment. There will be a delay between serving on a Content Advisory Committee for a test field and being able to apply the voucher code for that test field. Let's look at the Science (7-12) schedule for an example:

- o October 2022: Test Objective Review Conference
- January 2024: Item Review Conference 1
- o March 2024: Practice Test Item Review Conference
- July 2024: Item Review Conference 2
- o December 2024: Practice Tests Available/Test Registration Begins
- January 2025: Standard Setting

In this example, higher education representatives serve on committees in October 2022, January 2024, March 2024, and July 2024; however, the practice test is not available until August 2024. Higher education representatives will receive their vouchers following each committee meeting, but they won't be able to use their vouchers for that specific field until August 2024. (They can use vouchers for any other available practice test, such as High School Professional Knowledge and Skills, Integrated Science (Secondary), etc.)

MTTC: Professional Knowledge and Skills

<u>Guidance for Professional Knowledge and Skills (PKS) testing</u> has been updated on MDE's website to include Middle Grades (5-9) and High School (7-12) fields.

Effective January 1, 2026:

- All non-advanced endorsement areas excluding standalone ZN will require a PKS test (e.g. World Languages, Music, FACS)
- Candidates with an existing Standard, Professional, or Advanced Professional Certificate will **not** need to take a PKS test.
 - For example: I have EX on a Standard certificate and want to add ZO. In recognition of my Standard certificate, I do not need to take a PKS test).

MTTC: Test Center Experiences

Did your candidate have an unusual test center experience? Tell MDE! We want to work with Pearson VUE to ensure that every MTTC candidate gets the level of service and quality that they've paid for and are entitled to, but we can only improve what we know about.

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If you have a candidate who had a problem, please have them contact MDE with:

- o test center location, date, approximate time of day
- brief description of what happened

If your candidate prefers to remain anonymous, please send what they're comfortable sharing through a representative of your EPI. Please note that, at a minimum, we need the test center location and a brief description of what happened.

MTTC: Test Fee Reimbursement Grant Program

The Legislature and Governor again appropriated funds (\$1,100,000, a 10% increase from FY24) for grants to reimburse eligible applicants who take a required MTTC test for the first time during the 2024-25 academic year. Information about eligibility and other FAQ can be found on MDE's website. Candidates who tested on or after October 1, 2024 received notification from Pearson to apply for the grant. Emails are sent to the address used to register for the test(s). Applicants will need to complete an application for each test.

Sometimes emails don't get through to candidates. Candidates can check their account by logging into mttc.nesinc.com, selecting "My Account," then "Test Fee Reimbursement Grant Application." Professional Practices Reminders

Resources for Program Content

In support of safe school environments OEE reminds educator preparation providers of the importance of embedding content in programs that focus on the requirements of mandated reporting, handling criminal history disclosures, and the responsibilities set forth in the <u>Michigan Code of Educational Ethics</u>. A variety of training materials are located on MDE's <u>Educator Conduct Webpage</u> including:

- an overview of convictions that may impact the ability to receive an educator credential,
- links to governing legislation
- Ethics PowerPoints, legal language, video vignettes, and podcasts

Application Considerations

Review and determination of how to handle candidate background checks and disclosures of criminal history should be a part of EPP internal processes. MDE's role in determining eligibility of applicants begins following recommendation by the provider only during the application process for an educator credential. MDE

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cannot pre-determine eligibility for EPPs. This must be handled internally and with consultant of your legal teams as needed.
