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SECTION I: Legislative Updates

Below is a selection of bills currently (as of January 28, 2024) before the Michigan Senate and the House of Representative. 2023-2024 Legislative Session

The 2023-2024 legislative session has ended and any bills introduced in 2023-2024 that were not passed will need to be re-introduced in 2025.

- SB 567 & 568 Dyslexia training for pre-service and in-service teachers. *Now Public Act 146 & 147*.
- SB 744 Teacher Probationary Period. Now Public Act 134.

2025-2026 Legislative Session

State Budget Director Jen Flood is scheduled to present the governor's budget proposal to lawmakers Wednesday, February 5, 2025. The Executive Recommendation is the first look at the Fiscal Year 2026 budget. Following, the House and Senate will begin to draft their versions in anticipation of negotiations later in the spring.

Surveys & Candidate Tracking

Candidate Tracking

Thank you to all the EPPs for using the MOECS tracking system to start the rostering process!

EPPs are asked to continue using the system by enrolling all remaining candidates in their programs. This includes candidates scheduled to start their clinical internship in Spring/Summer 2025 as well as all other education candidates not yet in the system.

All candidates should be in the system with an updated status by June 30, 2025.

Note: Candidates enrolled in advanced programs (e.g., administrator, school psychologist, etc.) do not need be enrolled at this time, but we encourage EPPs to include them as they develop procedures for enrolling all candidates, regardless of program, into the system.

Survey Timelines

SS2025 Candidate Suite

- Candidates eligible for the SS2025 Candidate Suite Surveys should be in MOECS by February 15.
- MDE will distribute the rosters on February 19 to collect supervisor and cooperating teacher contact information.

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- Final rosters are due to MDE by March 5.
- Surveys are distributed March 19 and will remain in the field until June 15.

FW2024 Candidate Suite Surveys

- Surveys close on February 16.
- Reminders (with survey links) will be sent from Qualtrics on February 5 and February 12.
- Please check your Qualtrics dashboard and remind missing respondents to complete the survey.
